## Information Security Corporation Offers SecretAgent Trade-Up Program to PGP Users

Information Security Corporation (ISC) announces a new SecretAgent Trade-Up Program for all current Pretty Good Privacy (PGP) users. Under the terms of this program PGP users may obtain a copy of the latest version of SecretAgent 5, ISC's popular file encryption utility, at a greatly reduced price. This announcement follows on the heels of Network Associates recent dissolution of its PGP business unit after NA's failure to find a buyer for that division.

"ISC has been committed to the encryption market for over thirteen years now, and we are committed to it going forward," said Tom Venn, ISC's President. "The tragic events of September 11<sup>th</sup> have driven home the need for security to every American citizen, corporation, and government organization. We want to offer existing PGP users a low-cost way to make the transition from PGP to our popular and time-tested SecretAgent 5 encryption utility," Venn added.

Since 1991, ISC's SecretAgent product has been the product of choice for many of the Federal Government's most security-conscious intelligence, law enforcement, and defense organizations. The full-featured, "trade-up" version of SecretAgent 5 is now being offered to PGP users at a single user price of \$49.95. It will only install on a user's PC if some commercial version of PGP is already installed, but it will not uninstall PGP. Lower-cost site license pricing is also available.

SecretAgent 5 is a multi-purpose file encryption utility. It allows a user to encrypt and/or digitally sign any type of file. The new Advanced Encryption Standard (AES) and Triple DES ciphers are provided for bulk encryption; RSA, DSA, and Elliptic Curve public key schemes are employed for key agreement and digital signatures in a manner compliant with all relevant Federal Information Processing Standards (FIPS), as well as ANSI, ISO, and IEEE standards. Tight integration with popular Microsoft Office applications as well as direct mail tie-ins for Exchange/Outlook, Groupwise, and Netscape 6 make SecretAgent extremely easy to use. SecretAgent 5 can generate self-signed X.509 certificates for use without a Public Key Infrastructure (PKI), or PKCS#10 certificate requests for interoperability with all of the leading PKI products, including ISC's new low-cost CertAgent Certificate Authority (CA) software and CA products from VeriSign, Entrust, Baltimore Technologies, Microsoft, RSA Security, and CertCo. SecretAgent 5 also supports PKCS#11 cryptographic tokens from all leading manufacturers.
